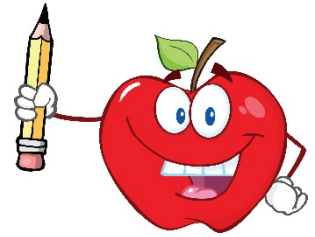


Name _____ **Direct Objects**



Direct Objects

The **direct object** is a noun or a pronoun that follows an *action* verb. It answers the question, "Whom?" or "What?" after the action verb. In the example below, the action verb is underlined, and the direct object is boxed.

EXAMPLE: The apple holds the pencil.
The apple holds the pencil.
