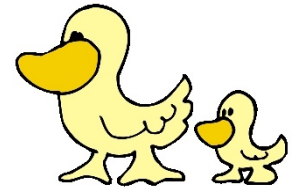


Subordinating Conjunctions

A subordinating conjunction introduces a subordinate clause. A clause contains a subject and a verb. A clause can function as a noun, adjective, or adverb in a sentence.
