Parallel Structure means using similar or the same grammatical structure in multiple phrases in a sentence.

Chiasmus is a literary device in which the grammar of one phrase is inverted in the phrase that follows, so two key concepts from the original phrase reappear in the second phrase in inverted order.

Chiasmus uses parallel structure, and is very symmetrical.

Anaphora is a specific form of parallel structure which is created by repeating a word or phrase at the beginning of successive phrases, clauses, or sentences in order to create emphasis.

Epistrophe is the repetition of a certain word or phrase at the end of sentences or clauses that follow each other.
