



Conditional Type 3

A conditional sentence expresses that one thing is dependent on something else. There are several types of conditional sentences. A Conditional Type 3 sentence describes an unreal past condition and its probable result in the past. It is formed by combining an "if" clause with a main clause.

Type	Verb Tense of the "if" Clause	Verb Tense of the Main Clause
Three	Past perfect	Perfect conditional

Example: If I had seen you, I would have said something.
