

Present Subjunctive

The **subjunctive mood** expresses a wish, a suggestion, a hope, a command, or an imaginary situation. The present subjunctive is formed with the base form of a verb followed by the word "that." The subjunctive mood follows nouns, verbs, or adjectives that make suggestions, commands, or requests.

- Suggestions: I advise that you take the bus to school.
- Commands: I insist that you study this afternoon.
- Requests: I ask that you put your dishes in the sink.
