- Known for their vibrant plumage and intelligence, they are large, social parrots that inhabit tropical rainforests.
- The largest rodent in the world, they are semi-aquatic mammals that live near rivers and wetlands in rainforest areas.
- A slow-moving mammal with a unique upside-down lifestyle, they are tree-dwellers known for their leisurely pace.
- Small crocodilian reptiles, they inhabit rainforest waterways and are skilled predators.
- Famous for their sharp teeth and strong bite, they are carnivorous fish often found in the Amazon River.
- Large and hairy spiders, they are ground-dwelling predators that often live in the humid underbrush of rainforests.
- A rare and elusive relative of the giraffe, they have zebra-like stripes and inhabits the dense rainforests of Central Africa.
