



Mixed Conditionals

A conditional sentence expresses that one thing is dependent on something else. There are several types of conditional sentences. A Mixed Conditional Type sentence describes an unreal past condition and its probable result in the present. It is formed by combining an "if" clause with a main clause.

Type	Verb Tense of the "if" Clause	Verb Tense of the Main Clause
Mixed	Past perfect or simple past	Present conditional

Example: If I had gotten my wish, I would be traveling now.
