

# Gerund as Subject and Object

A gerund is the -ing form of a verb that is used as a noun. The gerund is formed by adding the suffix “-ing” to a verb. Gerunds that come before the main verb function as subjects of the sentence. Gerunds that come after the main verb in a sentence are direct objects.

## Gerund as subject:

- Riding the bus stinks.
- Working hard is productive.

## Gerund as object:

- I failed at opening the jar.
- I excel at writing stories.
