The “snark mark,” first used by American typographer Choz Cunningham in 2007, is punctuation mark to end a sentence that indicates verbal irony in written text. It is a period followed by a tilde.

It tells a reader that what the text says is intended to be understood differently from the meaning of its words.

The snark mark indicates that the speaker found the talk to be anything BUT fascinating.
