- Reuse - The practice of using an item multiple times before discarding it, reducing the need for new resources and minimizing waste.
- Glass - A non-toxic, transparent material often used for bottles and jars, which can be recycled into new containers with minimal loss in quality.
- Biodegradable - A term describing materials that naturally decompose over time when exposed to the environment, often through microbial action.
- Cardboard - A sturdy, recyclable material made from paper pulp, frequently used for packaging and shipping, which can be reused or recycled into new paper products.
- Reduce - The practice of decreasing the overall consumption of materials and energy to minimize waste and environmental impact.
- Paper - A versatile material made from wood fibers, commonly used for printing, packaging, and other products, which can be recycled into new sheets for various uses.
- Repurpose - The act of finding new uses for an item, extending its life cycle by transforming it into something functional rather than discarding it.
