

Interjections

An interjection is a word or phrase used to express a feeling. Use different kinds of punctuation to set off injections from the rest of the sentence.

- Use a comma to set off interjections that express mild feelings.
- Use an exclamation mark to set off interjections that express very strong feelings.

Wow! There's a frog on a pogo stick!
