

Concrete and Abstract Nouns

A concrete noun is a person, place or thing that you can perceive with your senses. If you can see, hear, touch, smell or taste the thing a noun stands for, it is concrete. An abstract noun names a concept or an idea. You can think about it or feel it, but you can't see, hear, touch, smell, or taste it with your sense.
