May | Might

Modal auxiliaries modify the mood of a verb. *May* expresses permission or possibility, and its negative is *may not*. *Might* is used to express a smaller possibility. The negative of *might* is *might not*.

I may go to Japan one day.

I might win a free trip to Japan.
