

# To | Too | Two

The words to, too and two all sound the same, but they have very different meanings.

**To** is a preposition used to express movement or direction to a point (as to from): *We went to the movies. I will make out the check to you.*

**Too** means also, to a greater degree: *I liked it too. This place is too noisy.*

**Two** is a number: *I have two pencils.*
