



Future Perfect Tense

The future perfect tense expresses an action that is expected to be completed sometimes in the future. Form the future perfect tense with "will" + "have" + the past participle of the verb (which can be either regular or irregular in form):

Present Tense	Future Perfect Tense
remember	will have remembered
believe	will have believed
