



Interjections

An interjection is a word or phrase used to express strong feelings like anger, joy, disappointment, annoyance, fear, or surprise. Use an **exclamation mark** to set off interjections that express very strong feelings from the rest of the sentence. Use a comma to set off interjections that are not as strong. For example:

Yikes, you really made a mess.

Gee, I don't know what to do now.
