4. Engage in the Learning Process

With the "K" and "W" columns as guides, the next step is to immerse yourself in the learning process. Use reliable sources such as books, academic journals, videos, or expert interviews to gather information.

Take detailed notes while engaging with the material.
Stay focused on the questions from the "W" column to ensure relevance.
Allow flexibility for new questions or areas of interest that may emerge during the process.

This phase of the KWL process transforms curiosity into knowledge, fostering active engagement rather than passive absorption.

5. Filling Out the "L" Column (What I Learned)

After completing your research or lesson, revisit the chart and record your discoveries in the "L" column. This step involves summarizing key insights, answering questions from the "W" column, and reflecting on the overall learning experience.

Be concise but thorough in summarizing findings.
Highlight any information that challenges or enhances your prior knowledge from the "K" column.
Note additional questions that arise, as learning often uncovers new areas of curiosity.

For instance, after studying climate change, the "L" column might include, "The main contributors to greenhouse gases are transportation and industry," or "Solar and wind power are among the most effective renewable energy sources."

6. Review and Reflect

The final step is to review the completed chart and reflect on the learning journey. Comparing the "K" and "L" columns can reveal how understanding has evolved and where misconceptions were corrected.

Discuss your findings with peers, teachers, or mentors to deepen comprehension.
Use the chart as a reference for future learning or projects related to the topic.
Reflect on the process itself, identifying what worked well and what could be improved for next time.

For group settings, sharing and discussing completed KWL charts can foster collaborative learning and help participants learn from one another's insights.
