A synecdoche is a specific type of metonymy that occurs when one part of something stands in for the whole.

Metonymy is a figure of speech in which words are replaced with associated or related word.

Metaphor substitutes a word or phrase with another word or phrase to draw a comparison to their similarities.

A metalepsis is a specific type of metonymy that occurs when a literal phrase is replaced with a figurative phrase.
