



Conditional Type 2

A conditional sentence expresses that one thing is dependent on something else. A Conditional Type 2 sentence describes a hypothetical condition and its probable result. It is formed by combining an "if" clause with a main clause.

Type	Verb Tense of the "if" Clause	Verb Tense of the Main Clause
Two	Simple past	Present conditional or Present continuous conditional

Examples: If I got famous, I would celebrate.

If it was sunny, I would be skating.
