



## ANSWERS

Hyperbole is an over exaggeration. When hyperbole is added to hyperbole to add additional information about what is being overexaggerated, the additional hyperboles are also amplification.

Pathos: a quality in writing, speech, or video that makes the audience experience emotions. When additional information is added to a statement or a concept specifically in order to appeal to the audience's emotions, that information is simultaneously both pathos and amplification.

Anaphora: the repetition of a word or phrase at the beginning of successive clauses. It adds additional instances of a word or phrase, adding to the significance of that word or phrase without adding additional information.

Epiphora: the repetition of a word at the end of successive clauses or sentences. It adds additional instances of a word or phrase, adding to the significance and emphasizing that word or phrase without adding any new information.
