Do Barracudas Form Relationships with Other Species?

Short Answer Key

1. Mutualism is a relationship where both species benefit. Barracudas experience it when cleaner fish eat parasites and dead skin from their bodies.
2. Parasites harm barracudas by feeding on their blood or tissues, which can weaken them and make them vulnerable to infections.
3. Cleaner fish help barracudas by removing harmful parasites and dead skin, keeping them healthy.
4. Commensalism is when one species benefits and the other is not affected. Small fish use barracudas for protection without helping or harming them.
5. Barracudas are important because they help balance the ocean ecosystem through their roles as predators and by interacting with other species.
