### Open-Ended Response Answer Key

1. Rebounding is a critical aspect of basketball because it determines which team gains possession of the ball. Offensive rebounds give a team another scoring opportunity, while defensive rebounds prevent the opponent from scoring. Effective rebounding can also create fast-break opportunities and control the tempo of the game.
2. A turnover in basketball occurs when a team loses possession of the basketball to the opposing team. Examples of situations leading to turnovers include traveling violations, double dribbles, stepping out of bounds, and bad passes. Turnovers can be costly, as they give the opposing team a chance to score.
3. Offense and defense play contrasting roles in basketball. Offense focuses on scoring points and includes passing, dribbling, and shooting to create scoring opportunities. Defense, on the other hand, aims to prevent the opposing team from scoring by blocking shots, stealing the ball, and contesting passes. Both aspects are crucial for a team's success, and the balance between them is essential for winning games.
4. In basketball, field goals are worth either two points or three points, depending on where the shot is taken. Free throws are worth one point each. A shot made from beyond the three-point line is called a three-pointer and is worth three points. The combination of field goals, free throws, and three-pointers contributes to a team's total score, with the objective of outscoring the opponent.
