The Boston Tea Party: Destruction, Disguises, and Consequences

Short Answer Key

1. The protesters destroyed the tea by breaking open the tea chests with axes and other tools, emptying the loose tea leaves into Boston Harbor. They took care not to harm anyone on the ships. They used physical force and deliberate actions to destroy the tea.
2. The disguise of Mohawk Indians was a symbolic and practical choice. It concealed the participants' identities, reducing the risk of retaliation, and it sent a message that the protest was a collective act of resistance against British control.
