Short Answer Key

1. The envelope budgeting method helps manage money by dividing it into specific categories represented by labeled envelopes. This makes it easier to see where your money is allocated, encourages mindful spending, and prevents overspending in each category.
2. To create an envelope budget for the mentioned categories, I would:

It discourages overspending, ensures that money is available for necessary expenses, and prevents reliance on credit cards or loans. By staying within budgeted limits, individuals can allocate more funds to debt repayment, gradually reducing their debt.
