4. Negative space in photography refers to the empty or unoccupied areas surrounding the main subject. It can be used creatively within the Rule of Thirds to provide visual breathing room, add drama, or emphasize the subject by contrasting it with the emptiness around.
5. One example of a scenario where the Rule of Thirds may not be the best composition choice is when capturing a symmetrical subject, like a perfectly centered object or reflection, where centered composition enhances the visual impact.
