The Global Impact of the French and Indian War

Short Answer Key

1. The French and Indian War extended to the Caribbean and West Indies as the British and French competed for control of sugar-producing colonies. Key objectives included capturing important ports and resources.
2. The Battle of Plassey in India during the Seven Years' War resulted in the British East India Company defeating French forces, consolidating British influence in India. It marked a significant turning point in British colonial expansion in the region.
3. The Treaty of Paris (1763) reshaped territorial holdings by ceding Canada and most of North America to Britain, while Spain received Florida from Britain and Louisiana from France in exchange.
4. The French and Indian War had long-term consequences on international relations, including the tensions that contributed to the American Revolutionary War. It also reshaped the colonial landscape and set the stage for future conflicts.
