Impact of the French and Indian War on the American Colonies

Short Answer Key

1. The Treaty of Paris (1763) resulted in Britain gaining control of Canada, Florida, and most French territory east of the Mississippi River. This expansion of British territory created financial burdens due to increased taxation and contributed to colonial discontent.
2. Increased taxation imposed by the British government created financial burdens and sparked widespread discontent and protests among colonists who felt unfairly taxed without representation.
3. The Proclamation of 1763 prohibited colonists from settling west of the Appalachian Mountains to avoid conflicts with Native American tribes. This restriction angered colonists who sought westward expansion and contributed to tensions with Britain.
