Volleyball Court Unveiled: The Dimensions and Layout of the Game

1. The centerline on a volleyball court divides the court into two equal halves and extends from one sideline to the other. 3. The libero in volleyball is a specialized defensive player who wears a different-colored jersey. The libero's unique role is to excel in defensive skills, such as digging and passing, and to provide stability to the team's defense. The libero is allowed to replace any back-row player without prior notification to the referee and can enter and exit the game freely for defensive purposes. However, the libero has restrictions: they cannot attack or block at the net and cannot serve or attempt to block an attack from above the net level.
