Short Answer Key

1. An example of imagery from the diary is Anne's description of the annex as "an old building, completely run down, and an attic that's a horror." This imagery helps readers visualize the confined and deteriorating living conditions in the annex.
2. Anne's chestnut tree symbolizes hope and beauty amidst the chaos of war. It represents her desire for freedom and her connection to the natural world, offering solace and inspiration.
3. An example of foreshadowing is Anne's fear of being discovered and the constant need for silence, hinting at the looming threat of discovery. Foreshadowing builds tension and anticipation for future events.
4. Anne uses the metaphor of a bird in a cage to convey her longing for freedom and a life beyond the annex. She feels trapped and restricted, like a bird unable to fly.
5. An example of irony in Anne's diary is her evolving views on people. At times, she expresses disillusionment with human nature but later reveals her optimism and faith in the goodness of people. This irony highlights the complexity of her emotional journey.
