By reporting news, asking tough questions, and sharing facts, the media helps citizens understand what is happening in their government.

The Media as a Watchdog

One of the biggest jobs of the media is to act as a watchdog. This means they keep an eye on the government to make sure leaders are following the rules and making fair decisions. If a branch of government tries to break the law or abuse its power, the media can report on it, letting the public know.

For example, in the Watergate scandal of the 1970s, reporters discovered that people working for President Richard Nixon’s campaign had broken into a government office to steal information. Because of the media’s investigation, the public learned about the crime, and the Supreme Court ruled that Nixon had to turn over secret recordings. Eventually, Nixon resigned. This showed how the media helped hold the government accountable.

The Media and Public Opinion

Television interviews, newspaper articles, and online videos give different opinions so that citizens can decide what they think. The public can then contact their representatives to support or oppose laws.
