HDR photography involves capturing multiple exposures of the same scene at varying levels of brightness (underexposed, overexposed, and correctly exposed) and then blending them together during post-processing. It helps capture high-contrast scenes in landscapes by preserving details in both shadows and highlights. The resulting image displays a broader range of tones, enhancing the overall dynamic range.
