# Relative Adverbs

A relative adverb is an adverb that introduces an adjective clause. The relative adverbs are:

## EXAMPLES:

There was a time **when** we were friends.

Here's the house **where** we used to live.

This is the reason **why** we don't shop here.

In the examples above, the relative adverbs are bolded, the adjective clauses are underlined, and the nouns being modified by the adjective clauses are boxed.
