Settlements are placed at the intersection of hexagons, while roads connect these settlements.

Players also receive resource cards based on the terrain surrounding their initial settlements. These resources are crucial for building roads, settlements, and cities, as well as purchasing development cards.

One of the most unique aspects of Settlers of Catan is the trading system. Players can negotiate and trade resources with one another, fostering a dynamic and interactive gaming experience. Negotiations can be intense as players try to secure the resources they need while preventing others from getting ahead.

To earn victory points, players can:

- **Build Settlements:** Expanding your settlements across the island earns you victory points. Each settlement is worth one point, while upgrading a settlement to a city is worth two points.



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- **Achieve Longest Road:** The player with the longest continuous road made up of connected road pieces earns two points.
- **Attain Largest Army:** By playing development cards that include Knights, you can amass the largest army and earn two points.
- **Purchase Development Cards:** Development cards can be bought using resource cards. These cards can provide various advantages, including victory points.
- **Complete Special Objectives:** Some development cards and game scenarios may offer additional ways to earn points.

History of Settlers of Catan

Klaus Teuber, a dentist by profession and a passionate board game designer, created Settlers of Catan as a labor of love. He wanted to develop a game that his family could enjoy together, as well as share with friends. Teuber spent years perfecting the game's mechanics, balance, and overall appeal.

In 1995, Settlers of Catan was introduced to the world at the Essen Game Fair in Germany. Its unique blend of strategy, negotiation, and resource management immediately captured the attention of gamers. The game's popularity quickly spread across Europe and then to North America, where it gained a devoted fan base.
