Feathered Flight: The Shuttlecock and Badminton Strokes

Short Answer Key

1. A drop shot is a soft shot played close to the net, causing the shuttlecock to fall rapidly just over the net. In contrast, a smash is a powerful overhead strike that sends the shuttlecock downward into the opponent's court.

4. A shuttlecock has a rounded base with feathers extending from it, forming a cone shape. The feathers are typically made from goose or duck feathers, although synthetic materials are also used. It is incredibly lightweight and experiences significant air resistance during play.
