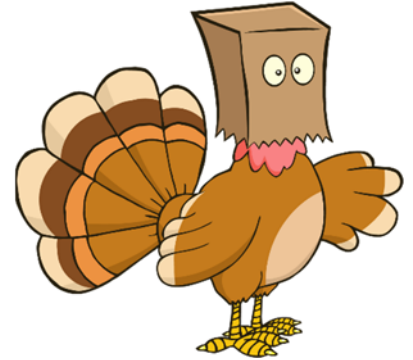


Thanksgiving Prompt Pack

3. Family Traditions: Describe a unique Thanksgiving tradition in your family. How did it start, and what does it mean to you and your family members?
4. A Thankful Heart: Create a journal entry for each day leading up to Thanksgiving, highlighting one thing you are thankful for each day. Explain why each thing is important to you.
5. Thanksgiving in the Future: Imagine what Thanksgiving will look like 50 years from now. How will traditions have changed? What new technologies or customs will be part of the celebration?
6. Cultural Exchange Dinner: Write about a Thanksgiving where your family invites friends from a different cultural background. How do you incorporate both cultures into the celebration? What new foods and traditions do you experience?
