Open-Ended Response Answer Key

1. In a world without the Internet but with the World Wide Web, accessing information would be limited to what is stored locally on your device or on physical media like books. Communication would still be possible through services like email, but it would be less instant and rely on local networks. For example, you could use a computer with pre-loaded information (like an encyclopedia) from a CD-ROM but wouldn't have access to the vast online resources. Researching current events or getting real-time updates would be challenging.
2. The World Wide Web has revolutionized access to information by making it faster and more convenient. Instead of physically searching through books and newspapers, we can now search for specific information online in seconds. Additionally, the Web allows for multimedia content, interactive experiences, and global collaboration that traditional media cannot provide.
3. One instance where the Internet is used for something other than browsing webpages is online gaming. While the World Wide Web allows you to access information and content like websites, online games require real-time data exchange and interaction with other players. In online gaming, the Internet enables you to connect to game servers, exchange game data, and play with people from around the world.

I'd say that the Internet is like the entire network of roads, highways, and infrastructure that allows vehicles (data) to move around. So, the Internet is the big network that carries everything, while the World Wide Web is one of the things it carries.
